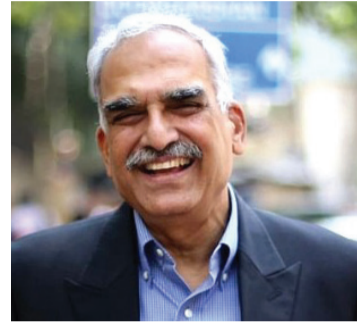
to support the success of its fellow Rotarians by doing business with them and referring others to them.
